LODGE NO. 102 - EUREKA, CALIFORNIA

FROM EARLY BEGINNINGS - "The Temperance Club" was started among the Finland-Swedish immigrants in Eureka in 1896 with 15 members. They built their own hall where they carried on social activities, mostly dances. In 1903 another temperance society, "Stjärnan av Vasa", was organized by Henry Lillsjo with 16 members. This society grew rapidly and also built its own hall; but in 1908 these societies united and one of the halls was sold. In the same year, the benefit society "Swanen" was founded and soon became one of the largest in the Benefit Association. Stjärnan and Swanen merged in 1920 to form lodge 102 OR with 188 members. The lodge grew rapidly, reaching a membership of 429 in 1935, the highest then in the OR, and has since been one of the largest and most active lodges. For years weekly meetings or parties were the rule, a youth group was active and likewise a sport club. Since 1951 the lodge has participated in the Scandinavian mid-summer festival, at which its folk dance group has repeatedly won acclaim. The lodge still ownes its hall, which is selfsustaining through rentals, and also leases a picnic and camping area on Van Duzen River, about 30 miles from Eureka. The lodge was host to the National Convention of the Order of Runeberg in 1962.



HISTORICALLY — In 1903 the temperance society "Stjärnan i Väster" (Star in the West) was organized by Henry Lillsjo. A few years later the society had quite a large membership and a mixed choir. In 1915 it was host to the convention of the Temperance Association. In 1923 its members were taken over by lodge No. 104 OR which was then organized by John Rusk and John Mattson. The first officers of the lodge were: president, Victor Josephson; vice pres., Conrad Gregg; fin. sec'y, John E. Smith; record. sec'y, K. I. Hokans; treas., Victor Bjors. Lodge was very active with many kinds of programs: discussions, lectures, mixed choir, plays, banquets, etc. The biggest occasion in the history of the lodge was the convention of the Order of Runeberg in 1935 — one of the biggest and best in the history of the Order and a big boost to the lodges in California. The choir of the lodge was active many years, and the younger people began to take hold of things; but then came World War II, the young people scattered and the older members had to step in again. Among the more active members of the older generation should be mentioned K. I. Hokans, Ellen Kamb-Levin, Arvid Johnson and Emil Forsman. The lodge had 350 members in 1935, 237 in 1950, and 158 at the end of 1966.

LODGE NO. 105 - BUTTE, MONTANA

HISTORICAL NOTES: The benefit society "Stjärnan av Butte" was organized in 1904 with 15 members and the temperance society "Livets Allvar" followed on May 20, 1906, with 16 members. Both societies were over the years very active, each in its own field of endeavor. The temperance society built its own two-story hall, sponsored classes in English for newcomers, had a choir, a theater group and even a cooperative business.

These societies merged in 1920 and became lodge 105 OR with 194 members and a hall worth \$7,000. The lodge

had for some time a drill team, a mixed choir, a club room for young people, and engaged for several decades in a variety of frequent social activities. The benefit functions of the lodge were for many years very important and expensive because of the high sickness and death rate of members who worked in the copper mines. But the lodge always kept solvent. High points in its history: Temperance Assn. Convention 1911, Benefit Assn. Convention 1919, Western District Convention 1941, and visit of Finland-Chorus in 1960. The membership was 157 in 1929, 168 in 1940, and is now 57. Dave Newman, one among the very active members, served over the years in several positions as an officer in the Western district

LODGE NO. 106 - TACOMA, WASHINGTON

HISTORICAL NOTES — The temperance society Mt. Tacoma No. 61 was organized August 12, 1908, by Dr. Carl W. Silverberg. Charter officers: Leonard Svedberg, Carl T. Svedberg, Edward Ahlskog, William Sundquist, Gust Hendrickson, Sanna Nyback, William Wiklund, William Sundsten, Hilda Benson and Henry Rosengren. For many years it was the most active society among the Scandinavians in Tacoma, especially by its meetings of open and free discussion of topics of general interest. The sick benefit society "Hemmets Stöd" was organized in 1910. In 1920 the two societies merged to become lodge No. 106 of the Order of Runeberg, and this lodge continued the activities of the former societies. The first delegate convention of the Order was held in Tacoma in 1922.

The singing society "Norden", later changed to "Finlandia", was organized in 1913. This chorus is still active. Chorus directors have been Martin Carlson, Linnea (Gord) Jensen and, at present, Carl W. Svedberg. On initiative by members of this chorus the Runeberg Singing Society was organized in 1924, and this society started the long series of Song Festivals which have been so important in the life of the Runeberg lodges in the northwest. Tacoma was also the leader in planning the very successful Runeberg concert tour to Finland in 1930, with Martin Carlson as director. That tour opened new vistas of understanding between the Order of Runeberg and the Swedes in Finland.

One charter member of the temperance society, the chorus and the lodge — Leonard Svedberg — is still active. Four members in the present photograph were also in the photo in Minnesskrift 1917: Leonard Svedberg, Mrs. Carl T. Svedberg, Carl W. Svedberg and Hanna Udd. The lodge had 214 members in 1929, 111 in 1940, and the present membership is 77.

LODGE NO. 108 - SOUTH BEND, WASHINGTON

A temperance society, "Eugen Schauman", was organized in South Bend in 1908 and a benefit society in 1912. They united in 1921 to become lodge No. 108 OR, with 61 members. The biggest event in the history of the lodge was a program for "Finland Relief" in 1940, in which town officers and hundreds of citizens participated. The membership was 86 in 1935, and 18 in 1966.

LODGE NO. 109 - FORT BRAGG, CALIF.

The temperance society "Vänskapsbandet" (Tie of Friendship) was founded in 1906 by Alfred Wicks with 13 members. Later the membership varied between 30 and 50. A benefit society was founded in 1914 with 16 members. The two societies merged in 1921 as lodge No. 109 OR with 73 members. First officers of lodge: presi-

dent, Ed LaSalle; vice pres., Mary Colberg; fin. sec'y, Ed Ness; record. sec'y, Amanda Stone; treas., August Johnson. Members of the lodge built their own hall and also acquired a separate cemetery plot. A sewing society and a Junior club were still active in the 40s and 50s. The membership was 96 in 1940 and 41 at the beginning of 1966.

LODGE NO. 110 - HOQUIAM-ABERDEEN, WASH.

TWIN LODGES — In March, 1907, the temperance society "Fyren" was organized with 19 members in Hoquiam. The first officers were; president, Erik Warnstrom; vice pres., John Haglund; rec. sec'y, Ernest Skog; fin. sec'y, Charley Raunio; treas., John Nygard. This society grew rapidly, built a hall, had a brass band and a theater group, and arranged discussions that created "much heat". In 1917 the benefit society "Faklan" was organized with 25 members. When the two societies united in 1920, lodge No. 110 started out with 194 members. The lodge was especially active in the twenties and thirties. It was host to the first Song Festival in 1924 and to another in 1929. Other special festive occasions were the Circle meeting in 1934 and the 20th Anniversary (founding of Facklan) in 1936.

In the neighboring city of Aberdeen lodge No. 122 OR was organized in 1923, in part by former members of lodge 110. This lodge also became very active. A choir was organized, likewise a sport club, and the lodge at one time had about 200 members. In 1927 the young

people in both lodges formed the "Humming Bird Club" which sponsored many social activities over a number of years. However, the membership in lodge 122 began to decline, and in 1959 the 64 remaining members joined the lodge in Hoquiam.

The lodge has also been host to Western district conventions and Bowling tournaments. The "Ladies of Runeberg" society has been active for many years and still meets regularily in the homes of members. The membership of lodge 110 was 216 in 1929, 146 in 1940, and is now 160.

LODGE NO. 111 - EVERETT, WASHINGTON

Mathilda Dahlbo organized the temperance society "Stjärnan av Everett" in October 1907 with 20 members. A benefit society was also founded in 1910, but it was dissolved after a few years. Star of Everett joined the Order of Runeberg as lodge No. 111, and its membership rose to 128 in 1926. After a dip during the depression it rose to 136 in 1936 — the highest figure ever reached. Among early active members were Victor Engman, Mike

Polls and Ellis Johnson.

The lodge has entertained Circle meetings, participated in district conventions, sponsored a choral group, and participated in the Finnish Relief campaign in 1940. William West was chairman of the campaign committee; co-chairman was Henry Jackson, presently U. S. senator from Washington. Two members, still active, Mrs. Andrew Lund and William West (who has always held an office in the lodge), attended the first Christmas program of the temperance society in 1907. Edward Hill was financial secretary 32 years. Past presidents still living: Ed Backman, Gust Alskog, Gust Morney and William West.

LODGE NO. 113 - BINGHAM CANYON, UTAH

MINERS' LODGE - The benefit society "Alprosen" was founded October 22, 1905, and continued active till 1920. Two years later, Dec. 15, 1907, the temperance society "Imatra" was organized with 15 members. This society was very active for some time with over 100 members and built its own "Imatra Hall", which later became Runeberg Hall, in the Carr Fork section where most of the Finland-Swedes had built their homes. The two societies merged in 1920 to form lodge No. 113 OR. Among the charter members of the lodge were the following: Jack E. Backlund, Lisa Backlund, Jacob E. Bartell, Alina Bartell, Simon E. Jofs, Anna B. Jofs, John H. Nylund, Johanna Johnson, John Enquist, Aina Enquist, Joseph Granquist, Beata S. Granquist, John Johnson, Jacob Osterholm, Fred Enquist, John B. Anderson, Andrew Erickson, Lennart Longs, Maria L. Longs, Karl O. Carlson, Johanna Carlson, John Swens, Hanna Swens, Henry Johnson, Axel Bjon.

During the ensuing years there was much activity in "Swede Hall", as it was affectionately called, by the inhabitants of Bingham Canyon. During the 20s and into the 30s the lodge had its own orchestra. Many programs, dances and other activities took place in the hall and were participated in by members, their children and even grandchildren.

In 1951 the Kennicott Cooper Co. began to buy up

properties in different areas of the Canyon, among them the Carr Fork section. The Runeberg Hall was therefore sold and demolished and the members of the lodge moved to other places, especially Salt Lake City, Murray, Midvale and West Jordan. But they still harbor fond memories of dancing schottish, polkas and waltzes to music resounding through the Canyon and are keeping the lodge alive.

LODGE NO. 116 - ASTORIA, OREGON

HISTORICAL NOTES — One of the forerunners of lodge No. 116 was the temperance society "Hoppets Stjärna", which was founded August 3, 1913, with twelve members. It was for a while an active society with a choir, a library, and a monthly bulletin. Another forefunner was the benefit society "Viktoria", which was started on January 15, 1915, with twenty-four members. On January 6, 1921, the two societies united to form lodge No. 116, OR. New programs and activities were then started and the lodge membership grew to 120 in 1924 and to 139 in 1939 — the highest ever. During the thirties and forties the lodge was active with two meetings each month. Several summers picnics were held together with the lodges in Coos Bay and Portland. Now meetings are held once a month in the homes of members.



LODGE NO. 117 - BERKELEY, CALIF.

A benefit society, "Golden Gate", was founded in 1918 and became lodge No. 117 OR in 1921. The first officers of the lodge were: president, John Mattson; vice pres., Andrew Lundgren; record. sec'y, Albert Carlson; fin. sec'y, John Ronquist; treasurer, Elsie Sandstrom. A membership campaign brought the membership over the 200 mark in 1926 and the lodge was active with a variety of programs. There was a choir, a drill team for a while, a sewing society, and later a basketball team. The most memorable event was the Runeberg Convention in 1935. John Rusk was a leader in the early period. George Anderson has been a singer and choir leader. The membership was 162 in 1929, 147 in 1940, and 50 in 1965.

LODGE NO. 120 - ROCHESTER, WASHINGTON

FIFTY-SIX YEARS — The temperance society "Nytt Hopp" (New Hope) was organized by Alex Koll of Seattle at Rochester in 1911, and this society became lodge No. 20 OR with 20 members in 1920. Earnest work began in the lodge in 1923 as a result of a visit by Alex Koll and Alfred Wicks of Seattle, and the membership rose to 101 in 1924. After the depression another period of great activity started in the latter part of the thirties, when a new hall was built and the membership rose to 180. "Swede Hall" became the center of social activities of many kinds. Frequent dances with old Scandinavian dance music were popular. Later, weddings, birthdays of older members, silver and golden weddings even of people who no longer reside in the community, have frequently been celebrated in the hall. The annual picnic of Circle I has been held several times in Rochester, most recently this year (1967). In 1952 the membership was 97; it is now 86.

TO REMEMBER — Lodge No. 121 was organized January 28, 1923. Of the 80 members at the start many were transfers from other older lodges. Charles Johnson, who had been instrumental in getting the lodge going, was elected president. Other officers were: rec. sec'y, Oscar Oling; fin. sec'y, Otto J. Bertill; treasurer, Evert Dahl. A sport club was started the same year and also a mixed choir led by Esther Adams Gragg. This choir took part in the first Song Festival in Hoquiam in 1924 and continued to sing in the Grand Chorus of these annual festivals as well as in the lodge festivities for many years. Strong bonds of friendship were developed through the choral activities in the Order. The lodge was host to the Song Festival in 1926 and to Circle meetings later.

A study club started a hand written paper which was

later taken over by the lodge and read at lodge meetings. Arnold Koutonen often entertained with his accordion. In its most active period the lodge had 212 members. During recent years the lodge has not been so active and the membership has gradually declined to 88.

Ellen Backman has served in her position as recording secretary as often as her husband has served in his. The lodge was active in the campaign for Finland-Aid in the city and contributed to the relief of victims of the flood in Portland in 1948. It was host to the Western District Convention in August 1952. One member, Rae V. Winger, has held offices in the Western District and has since 1962 been treasurer of the International Order of Runeberg. A number of members have moved to other states but still maintain their membership in lodge 123.

LODGE NO. 124 - VANCOUVER, B. C.

HISTORY — As a result of initial work done by John Soderman, Otto Sundell and Gust Wiik lodge No. 124 was organized Mar. 23, 1925, among the Finland-Swedish immigrants in Vancouver by Alex Koll from Seattle, then president of OR. The three above named persons were elected president, financial secretary, and vice president, respectively. As Thursday was "maids-day-off" meetings were for several years held Thursday evenings. Events in the history of the lodge may be summarized as follows: First "good Samaritan deed" was raising money to help a young man who had become blind; first marriage in the lodge Dec. 12, 1925, of the two marshals Anna Tornquist and Charles Peterson (they are also the only two who have been members continuously since founding of lodge); first choir formed in 1926 and also a Sewing Circle — with as many men as women attending meetings; first baby in the lodge, Doris Peterson, was born May 21, 1927; membership fell to a low point for several years during the depression, but the lodge revived in 1944 and a Junior Lodge was formed the next year; "Finska statens obligationer", held by the lodge, were donated to the T. B. sanatoria at Högåsen and Östanlid in 1949; "Bingo-project" started in 1957 has so far brought in \$6,500, divided equally between lodge and choir; the same year "OR Topics" bulletin was started, Doris Peterson editor, with a circulation of 80, now risen to 340; "Activity Club" started in 1958 and lodge hosted western district convention; in 1960 lodge was host to the Finland

Singers and biggest concert on their-tour took place in Vancouver; in 1961 bowling team was started and has been successful in Circle I tournaments; a Ladies Aid circle has been helpful in many ways.

On June 12, 1964, the first transatlantic Runeberg flight from the West Coast to Helsingfors took place; since then four other such flights have followed. These flights were organized by Albert Asplund and Ralph Hogberg. A return flight from Finland was welcomed on June 13, 1965.

In the field of culture, the choir has been active a long time: it has given many concerts and participated in Song Festivals under the appreciated leadership of Gunnar Abbors. The violinist and violinmaker Ragnar Helin and the young and gifted violinist Helen Hagnes have also contributed much in this field. During the last two years Erna Lindblom has been conducting classes in Swedish and Finnish.

Lodge No. 124 ended the year 1966 with a membership of 470 — the largest number in any lodge in IOR. "We are looking forward to hosting the Western district convention in 1969 and the International Convention in 1970".
